- Big Data: Big Pain or Big Gain for Lawyers?

Based on your chosen article, complete a journal assignment in which you thoroughly address the following questions:

- What is the **purpose** of data analysis within the field of criminal justice?
- How does proper data analysis assist the criminal justice professional in performing daily activities?
- Are there additional ways that data analysis can **improve** the daily routine of a criminal justice professional?
